INFORMATION FOR AGENCIES

Time4U Group Work is a service offered by Embrace Child Victims of Crime, a national registered charity. It is a programme for young people aged 13 -19yrs (or 24 with additional needs) who are, or have been, affected by domestic abuse and/ or sexual violence, and who are displaying violent, coercive or controlling behaviour at home or with a friend or partner. Time4u is a service delivered by Embrace Child Victims of Crime, a national charitable incorporated organisation (CIO).

This six-week programme focuses on supporting young people to develop emotional understanding, foster healthy relationships and find constructive ways of participating in the wider community.

HOW ARE DOMESTIC ABUSE AND SEXUAL VIOLENCE DEFINED?

Domestic violence and abuse are terms used to describe any incident, or pattern of incidents, of controlling or threatening behaviour - including violence or abuse. Sexual violence is any sexual act, or attempt to force a sexual act, by violence or persuasion (coercion).

WHAT CAN GROUP WORK OFFER?

Time4u Group Work is a six-week programme offering opportunities for young people to develop an insight into their behaviour and its impact on others as well as themselves. The course provides tailored activities and discussions to promote experience of more positive ways of relating

complete a referral form and submit it online.

Once the referral is received, contact will be made with parents or carers as soon as possible.

The young person's needs will be assessed at an initial meeting and, if Group Work is appropriate, they will be matched to their nearest group.

ELIGIBILITY FOR TIME4U GROUP WORK

To access the service, the young person should:

- have been a victim of, or witness to, domestic abuse and/ or sexual violence,
- and need support addressing destructive patterns of behaviour which might have arisen from this experience
- be safe from any offender;
- be willing to take part in a group and communicate verbally;
- be interested in working towards change, recognising that their behaviour is causing
- recognising that their behaviour is causing difficulties.

The law says young people can access support without parents or carers consent. We prefer a systemic approach involving working in partnership with parents where possible and practical. Young people will be offered a choice about this.
